In Maine, 13.1% of households experienced food insecurity in 2024, which translates to about 185,000 people, according to Feeding America. This includes 18.7% of children in Maine, the highest rate of child food insecurity in New England. Food insecurity is on the rise, with a 47% increase in the number of residents experiencing hunger compared to three years prior, according to Maine Public.

Several factors contribute to this increase, including the rollback of pandemic-era support programs, like expanded SNAP benefits and the Child Tax Credit, and rising costs of living. Food banks and pantries are seeing increased demand, with some reporting a 48% increase in visits compared to the previous year, according to WMTW.
